

# From Keith

As I sit down to write this article, I'm in between meeting with pastors. These two pastors are different in so many ways, yet one of the things that is similar is they are planning. They are planning for shifts that are happening with their church's summer schedule and planning for the new year of ministry. I know, many of you have taken part in evaluating and celebrating the ministry year that is concluding, and planning for the new ministry year that will begin in fall. With this comes much of the thoughts toward planning that the two pastors above were going through. To help support this, at the Pastors Lunch on May 9, I posed several questions. I want to pose to you similar questions that I pray are helpful and thought-provoking:

- 1. What do you need to celebrate for the 2022-2023 year?

  Celebrating accomplishments is vital. Maybe you are like me and you have the temptation to constantly charge ahead from one task to another. In other words, instead of the pattern of focus-strive-accomplish-celebrate-next focus-strive-accomplish-celebrate, you skip the celebrate phase. The problem is, this will lead to exhaustion and burnout. It will lead to decreased motivation. It will also lead to not striving again toward a similar task in the future. A leadership axiom that is time tested is, "That which is celebrated gets repeated". The same is true in our personal lives, if you celebrate it, it will be repeated. Taking it a step further, there is something that happens internally when a celebration that leads to another celebration occurs because this inevitably leads to more celebrations.
- 2. As we go into the slowdown of summer, how are you going to recharge and refresh? We all need times when we tap the breaks and slow down. These times of slowing down and times of rest are both helpful and important. It is helpful spiritually, physically, mentally, and

emotionally. My friend, God didn't create you to be a robot or a machine. He didn't create you to be running full blast all the time. Take this natural ebb and flow of the calendar year, to take some time to slow down, recharge and refresh.

3. What are your goals for the 2023-2024 ministry year? Before I get into the different categories a few things need to be mentioned: first, we need to bathe these times of thinking, reflecting, and planning in prayer. Specifically, we need to pray that the Holy Spirit would give us clarity, guidance, and wisdom. Second, we need to remember to keep our goals SMART:

**S**pecific — complete each statement fully and clearly. If you can't write it down so that someone else can understand what you are working to accomplish, is it clear and specific?

Measurable — include exact results that can be tracked and measured.

<u>Attainable</u> — is the statement realistic? Is it too large?

 $\underline{\mathbf{R}}$  elevant — does the statement fit with the others – is it relevant where it is placed within the strategy?

Time Bound — the statement has a slated completion date

- Church Ministry. This category is more for church leaders, ministry leaders, pastors, and staff.
- Personal Ministry. This category is for all believers. To be as plain as possible, we all have a personal ministry. For some of you, this leads to a trip point, if you are someone listed in the Church Ministry category, your church ministry and personal ministry are different, unique, and equally as vital. My friends, the ministry opportunities that you have in your everyday life from work, in your neighborhood, at the ball field, and around town are incredible. This category also includes spiritual discipline goals such as Bible study time, prayer time, sharing your faith, etc.
- Personal. What are the goals you have for yourself, personally? They can be health goals, relational goals (outside of family), or a particular task you dream of accomplishing.
- Professional. What goals do you have in your work life? Maybe it is a promotion, opening your own business, or hewn a professional skill.
- Family. What goals do you have in your family life? Maybe you are a dad or mom, what goals do you have for your family (make them together)? Maybe you are a child (at home or no longer at home), what goals do you have?
- 4. What are the obstacles that will need to be overcome to achieve those goals? There are always obstacles and difficulties to achieving goals. If a goal doesn't have some sort of obstacle or difficulty, it most likely isn't much of a goal. Here is the point: if you anticipate those obstacles or difficulties before they inevitably present themselves, you will be better prepared.
- 5. What resources will be needed to achieve those goals? Are there certain resources whether people or things that are needed to accomplish the goal? To go a step further, what do you need to do to obtain those resources?
- 6. What helps are available to achieve those goals? It is a rare thing for a goal to be accomplished without some level of help outside of yourself. You will need help. Are there people, a particular group, or organizations around you that can help?
- 7. How will God receive glory through completing these goals?

With this natural ebb and flow in the calendar year that is upon us, how will you rest and recharge? How will you plan and prepare as you think post-Labor Day?
