## From Keith

Several things are coming up within the Association that I would love to bring to your attention, all of which you will find in more detail in this newsletter. Things like the upcoming Annual Meeting on October 22nd at FBC Snow Hill, Church Vision Intensive on Friday and Saturday, September 22-23, and the "Cultivating a Disciplemaking Culture" workshop on Saturday, September 30th. I encourage you to notice these things and more that are coming up.

I wanted to take a moment to speak about the EQUIP Network training that we as an Association are preparing for. EQUIP Network is through Southeastern Baptist Seminary and seeks to empower local churches and ministry organizations like NBA to take an active role in the theological education of their students. Those participating can earn credit hours for a Master of Divinity degree or Master of Arts in Christian Ministry degree that is directly attached to SEBTS. As I spoke to the Leadership Team, my motivation for encouraging us to take this on is twofold.

First, many of our pastors are bi-vocational (I prefer the term "multi-vocational"), and this number nationwide will only increase in the next $10-15$ years. I predict many churches not only here but nationwide with full-time pastors will be forced to move toward multi-vocational pastors. Part of this will be due to a reduction in funds within a church, and the other part will be the increase in living expenses. To get to the point, it will be increasingly harder for pastors who know they will be multi-vocational to achieve a M.Div. or MA Ministry Degree in the traditional manner. More and more they will have to rely on online classes. Online classes are good and great and helpful, but they are missing the personal interaction with the one teaching the class and others who are in the class. This is where EQUIP comes in. EQUIP allows a student to get that interaction, but even more they engage in mentoring as they prepare for ministry. This need for things like EQUIP will increase in the coming years, and I for one would rather be proactive in this equipping rather than reactive.

Before I move to the second piece of my motivation with the Leadership Team, it is important to know that those taking the classes for credit, will need to apply and be enrolled at Southeastern Baptist Seminary. Though they may be taking classes for credit here at the Association building, they are a student at SEBTS. As a student, those taking courses for credit will be responsible for tuition to SEBTS.

Second, EQUIP gives us as an Association a tool to equip our churches. One of the things I love about EQUIP is anyone can audit a class or classes and even better they can do this FREE. While they will not get official credit for the class, they will get the training and benefit of the class. Imagine a Sunday School or Small Group leader taking Biblical Exposition (preaching class) or a discipleship class. Maybe a church leader taking a leadership class. I could continue with the possibilities of equipping for those in our churches.

We are progressing with a start date with the first of the year (Spring Semester). Classes will be in the evening or on Saturday. As we prepare for this I and the Leadership Team need to know your interest and the interest from those who will be taking the classes for credit. The Leadership Team and I are looking at starting with the possibility of two courses (3 credits each): Personal Discipleship and Disciple-Making Practicum and/or Bible Exposition I: Hermeneutics and Preparation Practicum.
