From Keith

We are coming up to a favorite time of the year, Christmas. What a wonderful time to remember the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. I want to encourage you toward two things:

- 1. Celebrate with joy and gladness the birth of Jesus this Christmas. It is so easy to get caught up in the hustle and bustle of family gatherings, company gatherings, and Christmas shopping that we never slow down, much less stop, to celebrate the birth of Jesus.
 - What is a way that you can intentionally stop and just celebrate? For my young family, there are four things we do intentionally to stop and celebrate Jesus.
 - The first is a birthday cake and party for Jesus. With this, we make a homemade cake and decorate it. As we do, we make a point of talking about Jesus and His birth.
 - Second, we drive around town and hand out RACK (Random ACts of Kindness) bags to those in need. As we do this, we discuss why we are handing out these bags.
 - Third is the Christmas Eve service. As a pastor, this was one of my favorite services and as an AMS no longer involved with the planning of a Christmas Eve service it is still a family favorite. There is something about this time that helps each person in my family to focus on the birth of Jesus.
 - Fourth, before bedtime on Christmas Eve, our family devotion which has turned into a tradition is the telling of the Christmas Story. Up to this year, I have always used some figurines from a nativity to tell the story, though this year as my family is getting older, I am thinking of adjusting the method of telling the Christmas Story.
 - Again, these are some of the things my young family does to slow down and stop to celebrate the birth of Jesus. What are some things that you or you and your family can do to stop and celebrate the birth of Jesus?
- 2. Invite a friend, relative, co-worker, or neighbor (I call this FRAN's- Friends, Relatives, Associates, and Neighbors) to church around Christmas. Did you know that the vast majority of people begin attending a church because of a personal invitation? It's true. Yes, our culture is changing, but people are still very open to an invitation generally, especially around Christmas and Easter.

Thinking into 2024, there are two things I want to emphasize or reemphasize:

First, is the EQUIP Network Program through Southeastern Baptist Theological. EQUIP Network seeks to empower local churches and ministry organizations like NBA to take an active role in the theological education of their students. Those participating can earn credit hours for a Master in Divinity degree or Master of Arts in Christian Ministry degree that is directly attached to SEBTS. My motivation for EQUIP is twofold.

For one, many of our pastors are bi-vocational (I prefer multi-vocational) and this number nationwide will only increase in the next 10-15 years. I predict it will be increasingly harder for pastors who know they will be multi-vocational to achieve a M.Div. or MA Ministry Degree in the traditional manner. More and more they will have to rely on online classes. Online classes are good and great and helpful, but they are missing the personal interaction with the one teaching the class and also others who are in the class. This is where EQUIP comes in. EQUIP allows a student to get that interaction, but even more they engage in mentoring as they prepare for ministry. The need for things like EQUIP will increase in the coming years, I for one would rather be proactive in this equipping rather than reactive.

Those taking the classes for credit, will need to apply to and be enrolled at Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. Though they may be taking classes for credit here at the association building, they are a student at SEBTS. As a student, those taking courses for credit will be responsible for tuition to SEBTS.

Secondly, EQUIP gives us as an association a tool to equip our churches. One of the things I love about EQUIP is anyone can audit a class or classes and even better they can do this FREE. While they will not get official credit for the class, they will get the training and benefit of the class. Imagine a Sunday School or Small Group leader taking Biblical Exposition (preaching class) or a discipleship class. Maybe a church leader taking a leadership class. I could continue with the possibilities of equipping for those in our churches.

Our start date is the week of January 22 for the Spring Semester. Classes will be in the evening or on Saturday. The Leadership Team and I are looking at starting with the possibility of 2 courses (3 credits each): Personal Discipleship and Disciple-Making Practicum and/or Bible Exposition I: Hermeneutics and Preparation Practicum.

If you are interested, please let me know as soon as possible, so we can make the necessary preparations and help you get prepared prior to January 22. Note, we must have at least one student taking the course for credit for that course to be taught.


The second thing I want to emphasize as we head toward 2024 is a statewide emphasis called ServeNC. ServeNC is a ministry day blitz as your church serves and loves its community. To help you think about it, it is a rebranded Operation InAsMuch. Personally, I am all for anything that involves churches serving and loving their community. The date of ServeNC spans 2 weekends, so your church can choose the date that best fits. The date is August 3-10. In the months to come, I will be putting out a list of ministry project ideas, which will also include a list that the state is putting together. This list will include ideas for ages ranging from children to senior adults. First and foremost, I want to encourage your church to take advantage of this time and serve and love your community. Secondarily, the association will also be putting a few different projects together to help mobilize churches.

While I realize August seems to be a long way off, I want to encourage you to go ahead and register your church participation by signing up at servenc.com. Or scan the QR code in the Serve NC graphic on page 5 of this newsletter.
