As we head toward Mother's Day, what a wonderful time to celebrate mothers, grandmothers, and all of the ladies that have influenced our lives. Before I tell you about some ladies who have influenced my life, I feel like I need to speak on something that I believe someone needs to read. I know that for many, Mother's Day is a wonderful celebration; yet for others, it is less than a wonderful celebration. For those who find it to be less than a wonderful celebration, I realize there are many different reasons why. I will not get into the various reasons, yet my point is to simply say, I empathize and sympathize with you. I realize the heartbreak and the heartache. I realize the 'woulda, shoulda, coulda's'. I realize the 'what ifs'. I realize the pain. I realize you may search for reasons to be out of place on Mother's Day. Yet, through all of this, I want to encourage you to realize that there is still much to celebrate.

Speaking of a few ladies who have been a huge influence in my life:

First, my mother, Debbie. A mother that loved and cared for me. A mother who strived to give me a happy childhood and helped me to make wise decisions. A mother who has been with me through the good, the bad, and the ugly. Now she is a little older and has a few more wrinkles. No doubt I am the reason for a good number of those wrinkles. There is not enough paper to talk about the significant positive influence my mother has had in my life. Yet through all of this, she was not and is not perfect. Let's be honest, none of us are perfect. I rank #1 in that category. We all have our deficits and flaws. We all have those decisions we wish we could take back. We are all human. I am hugely and positively influenced by my mother.

My friend, let me dispel a myth. A myth that may be limiting and holding you back. We don't have to be 'perfect' to be a positive influence to those around us. We put incredible and unbearable pressure and expectation on ourselves to be perfect. We think, 'because I am not perfect, that means I am flawed beyond usefulness'. This is not true and is simply silly talk. Let me say this as nicely and with as much love as I can: "Stop it"! Stop this silly talk. Stop the unattainable expectations. Stop deflating yourself. Stop it!

Sometimes, it is our imperfections that make us special. It is through our imperfections that makes us perfectly able to pour into another's life. For the ladies reading this, whether you are a mother, a grandmother, an aunt, or a lady of influence, be imperfectly perfect as you positively influence the lives around you.

Second, let me speak of my wife, Paige, the mother of our two wonderful sons. As I write this newsletter article, it is our Anniversary weekend as we care for a child who is recovering from having his tonsils removed. You may be saying that I am speaking of her to score points, to this I would say I can use all the points I can get because I am constantly in the 'red'. Yet, her care for our two sons and me is incredible, so incredible that words fail to describe it. I am fairly certain that we, a house full of boys, drive her to the brink of a padded room, but her love, care, and patience are felt and known. I am certain that she both underplays and dismisses the huge positive influence she has on our family.

I want to remind you that you are valuable and worthy. Sometimes you may downplay or dismiss your contributions and accomplishments. This could be because you don't see your worth or value. But remember, you are valuable and worthy because you are valuable and worthy to the Lord. After all, you are a child of the King. If you are a lady reading this, I want to emphasize that you have the potential to be a positive influence on the people around you, including your family. By simply being yourself, you can make a difference in the lives of those you care for. Be that positive influence

for your family by showing love, care, and taking the time to listen to those around you with patience.

I could also speak of my grandmothers and how they poured into my life or my mother-in-laws, but let me speak of one other person, Mildred Hales. Mildred isn't an aunt or even a cousin, she isn't related to me at all. Mildred was a neighbor and more directly one of my Sunday School teachers as a young child. You see, growing up my family was what I now call a 'hit and miss' family, in that we would attend church for a little while and then disappear for a while, and repeat. To be honest, we were more missed than hit. Mildred recognized this and approached my parents to ask if they wanted her to pick me up for Sunday School on her way to church. That is what she did. She would pick me up in the morning and my parents would pick me up later that morning. Not only that but she was also my Sunday School teacher for a few years and she spent time pouring into my class. I remember that class distinctively. I remember the effect that she had on my classmates and I. I remember how she has kept up with me through the years.

Mildred is a lady of influence in my life. The positive influence she had in my life not only affected me but also the lives that I have affected. Further, I am confident that she doesn't realize the impact that she has had on my life.

The point I am trying to make is that so often we don't realize the effect we have on those around us. I am convinced she has never realized the huge impact that these small actions made. We think that if it isn't big and life-altering, then it is too small to think about. What I propose to you is the things you do that you see as small and insignificant, are hugely significant in someone's life. What we see as 'nothing' is everything to the person being affected.

For the ladies reading this I want you to know that what you do matters. Maybe you are a Sunday School teacher like Mildred; maybe you volunteer in the nursery or children's church; or maybe you are a caring neighbor. What you do matters. What you do has the

capacity to be hugely impactful in someone's life.

Ladies, how are you making a positive influence in the lives of your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews, and other children your life intersects with?

While you (and all of us) think about this question, let me give you a few additional thoughts:

1. Be intentional. It is a very rare thing that something truly great happens by accident. Great things happen because someone was intentional. Be a person of influence by being intentional.
2. Be involved. Making an impact means you are actively present. Making an impact means you make that intentional decision to pour yourself into others and be involved in places where it is conducive to pour yourself into others.
3. Watch your self-talk. Self-talk is that constant inner conversation that all of us have. It is the things that we tell ourselves. This self-talk can be both a good and a bad thing, yet what makes the difference is the content of that conversation. When we tell ourselves that we are bad, awful, unworthy, and lack value, we not only negatively affect the way we see our personal lives but we also hamper our ability to make a positive impact on the lives around us. Let me ask you this question: If I said to you the things that you tell yourself, would we be friends?
4. Stay connected and open. Relationships and opportunities ebb and flow, yet when we remain connected and open, we position ourselves to make a continued positive impact on another's life. When I think about this, I think of the parable of the Prodigal Son or as I prefer and think is more correct 'The Searching Father'. What would have happened if this father didn't seek to stay open and connected? Would the parable have finished with the great celebration "for this son of mine was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found" (Lk 15:24).

Maybe your hand has been slapped away; keep it extended. Stay connected and open.

5. Be like honey. We have all heard the often-quoted proverb, "You catch more flies with honey than you do with vinegar." You will have a larger impact on those around you through your love and care than you will through criticism. People are attracted to those who are positive and helpful, while a negative person repels them. Let me put it this way: you can't be a positive influence by being negative.
6. Your impact is greater than you believe. So often we belittle our influence and at other times we truly do not appreciate the influence we have on others. Either way, your influence is far greater than you believe it is. Stay the course.

My dear friends, leave a positive influence on those around you and more importantly leave a godly influence on those around you. The lives around you matter. It is worth the effort, the time, and the energy.

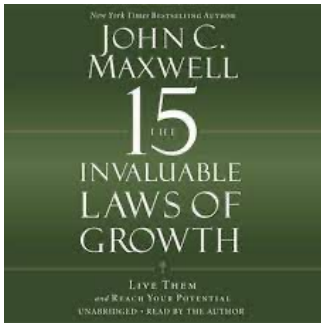

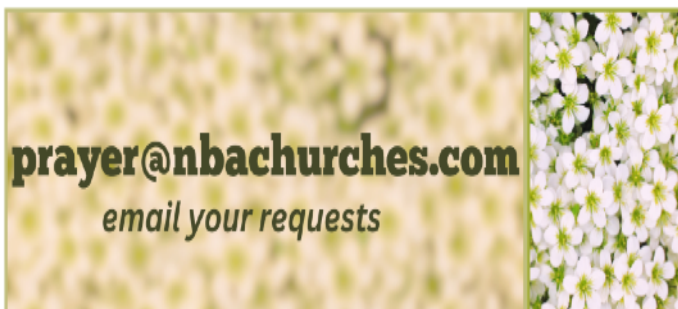

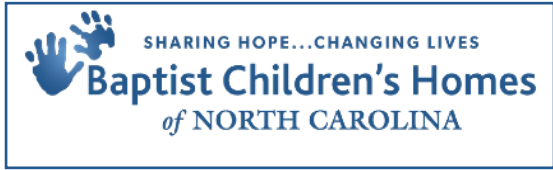
