Hey Friends,

In a world that often feels all alone and disconnected, there's something significant that connects us all as the body of Christ: we're stronger together. We're not meant to be isolated or to be hermits or to be separate islands of faith, but to be like a big network of believers working together to spread the love of God. We are truly better and stronger together. This is the heart of what we do as churches and partners.

The Great Commission, found in Matthew 28:19-20, states, "And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age (ESV).'" The Great Commission isn't just a suggestion—it's a command. Jesus calls us to "go and make disciples of all nations." For many of us, this means going on big international missions, and while those are important, the command also encompasses right where we are. It starts in our neighborhoods, our communities, and our towns. And the best way to do this is by working with other churches and ministries that are on the same page.

At the Neuse Baptist Association, we believe so much in this idea that we're here to help you make these partnerships happen. We're here to help you find, connect with, and build these important relationships. I like to think of the NBA as a bridge builder, helping to connect churches with local schools that need mentors, food pantries that need volunteers, and community centers that are ready to host Bible studies. We see the big picture and we're committed to helping you find your place in it.

I've seen firsthand the amazing things that happen when churches create these Ministry and Missional partnerships. I've seen the Lord do great things. I've seen lives changed. I've seen the gospel advance.

I have also seen amazing things when churches partner together with these partnerships as they love on their community. This may be working together to serve a local homeless shelter, sharing resources and volunteers to make a bigger impact than a single church could. These aren't just random stories; they're powerful examples of the Holy Spirit. The same is true when churches partner together to do ministry together, plant a church, or work together to strengthen a sick church.

It's easy to get caught up in being inward-focused. To be inward-focused means your focus as a church turns inward, and you focus solely on your own church. We can get so wrapped up in our programs, attendance, and building projects that we forget what we're really here for: making disciples. The truth is, churches that are always looking inward will always be unhealthy and anemic. They might be busy, but they're busy like a hamster on its wheel as it runs around and around, not truly going anywhere. In effect, unhealthy churches aren't making a difference in that they're not advancing the gospel, they're not making disciples, they're not making their community noticeably better because of the gospel. In truth, they're just taking care of things, not growing them. The light of the gospel, meant to shine brightly for everyone, becomes a dim light inside our walls. They become a 'holy huddle' where there are a lot of 'buts'. The party line is 'but': 'But we can't do this because of...', "But we have never done it that way before", "But that would require us to do...."

But there's a better way! A church that's focused on reaching out to the community will always be getting stronger. It's not just about having more people; it's about being spiritually alive and thriving. When a church wants to connect with its neighbors—when it goes from asking "What can we do for ourselves?" to "What can we do for our neighbors?"—it breathes in the fresh air of God's purpose. It finds new passion, a clearer vision, and a deeper sense of community. It fulfills its calling not just to exist, but to make a real difference in the world.

So, what does this look like for your church?

It might start small. It could be teaming up with a parachurch organization in your town. It might be adopting a local school, grade, or class and providing supplies, mentors, and encouraging the teachers and staff. It might be creating a Missional Partnership with a church planter who is across the state or in another state. It might be creating a Missional Partnership with a missionary or missionary group that is ministering in another part of the world.

My friends, as with so many things, the first step is often the hardest, but it's also the most rewarding.

I know this message might sound challenging and out of our comfort zones, but it's actually an awesome opportunity for us to step up and out of our comfort zones and trust King Jesus. It's about putting aside our pride and personal goals for the Kingdom. But guess what? It's also incredibly encouraging! When we work together with other churches, with para-church organizations, with schools, and with missionaries, we get to witness the incredible work God is doing around us. We see His grace in new and unexpected ways, and it reminds us that He's building His church, and nothing can stop it!

So, let's not be shy or inward. Let's be bold and brave. Let's do this together! The Neuse Baptist Association is here to help you take that first step. We're ready to be your resource, your guide, and your partner in this mission. Let's fulfill the Great Commission by shining the light of Jesus brightly in our local community and beyond.

Leon "Gene" Miller, born on October 16, 1932 in New Bern, North Carolina went home to the arms of his Lord and Savior on July 26, 2025.

He was a loving husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather, brother and uncle. But most importantly, a faithful servant of his Lord and Savior. He loved to travel, especially on mission trips to Eswatini, South Africa. He loved cooking and enjoyed many mission trips throughout the states and was usually in charge of cooking the meals for all those serving and those being served.

He really loved family gatherings with all of his family, especially in the mountains or on cruises, which he did not hesitate to book those cruises. He enjoyed hearing the laughter of his grands and great grands. He was very proud of each of them and could be heard bragging on them often.
